Dear Mr. Brovetto:

The W.K. Kellogg Foundation is pleased to provide a grant to Universidad de la Republica (University of the Republic) in the amount of \$1,990,000 to improve the health of people in Latin America and the Caribbean by redirecting health professions education toward primary health care. This letter is based on a proposal and your letter of support dated July 8, 1992.

The project will run from October 1, 1992, through June 30, 1996, according to the following budget:

The first payment on this commitment will be made upon receipt of a letter from you confirming agreement to this commitment letter, the enclosed "General Requirements," and the following conditions:

1. Funds provided by the Foundation will be accounted for separately in the business office of your organization and will be used only for the purposes specified in the aforementioned budget. If at the end of this commitment there remain any unexpended funds or if the program is terminated at any other time, the unexpended cash balance is to be returned to the Foundation and may not be transferred to any other fund. Advance Foundation approval must be requested in writing for disbursements deviating from the line items of the approved budget.

2. At the end of each project period, your organization will provide the Foundation with a report, written in English, which will include (a) a narrative progress report of the program, including the progress in planning and executing project evaluation and the result of that evaluation to date; and (b) a statement of expenses, prepared on the Foundation's Report Form, reflecting any unexpended funds, and certified correct by the chief financial officer of your organization. The financial statements to the Foundation should report expenditures according to the line items in the aforementioned budget. A final report is to be provided to the Foundation not later than three months after the close of the grant, unless an extension has been granted.
3. No part of these funds shall be paid to any Kellogg Foundation Trustee, officer, or employee for any purpose.
4. Your organization's records and supporting documents related to this grant will be made available for audit at the request and expense of the Foundation.
5. Funds provided by the Foundation shall be used exclusively for charitable, scientific, literary, or educational purposes. No part of these funds shall be used to:
 - a. carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation,
 - b. influence the outcome of any specific public election, or to carry on, directly or indirectly, any voter registration drive,
 - c. make any grant to an individual for travel, study, or other similar purposes which is not awarded on a nondiscriminative basis.
 - d. make a grant to other than a charitable organization which is publicly supported, or
 - e. undertake any activity for any other purposes other than charitable purposes.


This project is part of a WKKF-operated program, the UNI Program. The projects under such program have a common philosophy, and the Foundation will undertake a number of activities aiming at supporting the full development of each project and the group as a whole. It is, therefore, understood that the University will facilitate the attendance of project participants in meetings organized by the Foundation as part of the UNI Program and, also, support their participation in interinstitutional working groups. It is also expected that the University will be ready to share the lessons learned and experience gained with participants from other projects of the UNI Program.

It is also understood that the proposal presented by the University is a joint initiative of your organization in collaboration with other institutions and community groups. Therefore, the Foundation considers that funds are granted to your organization on behalf of all institutions involved with the project, and are to be shared with the health services and community groups as stated in the proposal.
